Local Rules

Out of Bounds

A ball is out of bounds when it is beyond any wall, fence or hedge defining the recognised boundary of the course.

Holes 1, 6, 9, 13, 14, 16 A ball is out of bounds if it is beyond the line between the course-side edges of the white stakes protecting the putting and chipping area right of the first tee, to the left of the 6th hole, left of the 9th hole and behind the 13th green, 14th tee extending down the left of the 16th hole.

Hole 3. A ball is out of bounds if it is beyond the edges on the 3rd fairway side of the white stakes on the right of the 3rd hole, this area extends beyond the front of the 4th green as defined by the white stakes.

Hole 9. A ball is out of bounds if it is in or over the ditch that runs on the right side of the fairway and green.

Hole 17. The boundary of the course is defined by the course side edge of the "pylons" supporting the protection fence alongside the 17th tees.

Hole 18. the boundary of the course is defined by the course side edge of the low wall in front of the Clubhouse. The boundary of the course extends along the course side edge of the steps to the clubhouse, the 10th tee side edge of the concrete path edging, beyond the line on the tarmacked path and the course side edge of the stones, painted white, at the rear of the putting green. A ball is out of bounds if it is beyond the course side edge of the white posts at the back left of the green.

Penalty Areas

All Penalty areas are defined by course side edge of red stakes at ground level. Relief should be taken in accordance with **Rule 17.1d**.

On the **18th and 10th holes** the shale path, grass verge and hedge within the area bounded by red stakes is a Penalty Area. Relief should be taken in accordance with **Rule 17.1d**.

Ground Under Repair

Relief in accordance with **Rule 16.1b** must be taken from any area marked Ground Under Repair in the general area of the course.

Abnormal Ground Conditions/Immovable Obstructions

Hole 4. The white stakes defining the out of bounds on the 3rd hole should be treated as immovable obstructions and relief may be taken in accordance with **Rule 16.1b**.

Paths. Relief may be taken in accordance with **Rule 16.1b** for any ball that is lying on a path or road with an artificial surface. **With the exception of the shale path that crosses the 10th and 18th holes, see Penalty Areas.**

Bridges. Relief may be taken in accordance with **Rule 16.1b** for any ball that is lying on a bridge or penalty area crossing point on the 6th, 7th, 11th, 12th and 13th holes.

Matting. Relief may be taken in accordance with **Rule 16.1b** when a ball lies on ground that clearly has plastic or rubber matting under the surface to protect the ground from excessive wear.

Aeration Holes, if a player's ball lies in or touches an aeration hole:

(a) Ball in General Area. The player may take relief under **Rule 16.1b**. If the ball comes to rest in another aeration hole the player may take relief again under this Local Rule.

(b) Ball on Putting Green. The player may take relief under **Rule 16.1d**. But interference does not exist if the aeration hole only interferes with the player's stance or, on the putting green, on the player's line of play.

General Course Safety

Public footpaths cross the back nine.

PEDESTRIANS HAVE THE RIGHT OF WAY.

Signs around the course indicate potential hazards,

Do not play

Towards the 2nd green when the Men's 3rd Tee is occupied

Towards the 15th green when the 16th Tee is occupied

Towards the 18th green when the 10th Tee is occupied
