

16. KNOCK OUT COMPETITIONS

This Bye Law provides details of the annual Knockout Competitions played at Heaton Moor Golf Club. They are all Match Play Competitions and normally commence in April and complete in September.

The Professional will normally take entries for all the Knockout Competitions in February/March.

A draw for all the competitions will be made by the Golf Team which will be posted on notice boards in the Clubhouse it will also be available on "How-Did-I-Do".

There will be a KO Finals Day scheduled for a Sunday in September on which all KO Finals MUST be played. If you are not available to play on "Finals Day" you must not enter the KO Competitions. If during the season you become unavailable for "Finals Day" you must immediately withdraw from the competition.

EXCEPTIONS if a player qualifies for more than one KO final then the following "Priority Order" apply and players must play in the highest priority competition they qualified for on "Finals Day". (The "lower priority" Finals that cannot be played on "Finals Day" must be rearranged to another mutually agreed date.)

Men Priorities are Men's Scratch Singles, Men's Handicap Singles, Men's Doubles, Men's Senior Singles and Mixed Foursomes

Ladies Priorities are Ladies Singles, Ladies Doubles and Mixed Foursomes.

Additionally, there will be a date by which each round must be completed and there will be no extensions under any circumstances to allow matches to be played after the deadline date published.

It is the responsibility of the players involved to declare a result by the deadline date and to enter details of that result on the draw sheet or email the Golf Team by the deadline date. Failure to do this may result in both players or pairs forfeiting the match.

16.1 Men's Singles (Scratch)

Open to Full Members this is a scratch competition so no handicap allowances apply.

All rounds prior to the Final to be played over 18 holes from the White Tees. The Final to be played over 36 holes from the White Tees.

In all rounds should the match be tied after 18/36 holes sudden death match-play will commence immediately at the first hole and holes played until a winner can be declared.

Two prizes are normally awarded and the winner qualifies to play in the Millennium Trophy

16.2 Men's Singles (Handicap)

Open to Full Members. To be eligible to play in the Men's Singles KO competition a player's Handicap Index must be based on having submitted a minimum of 6 acceptable scores (3 of which must be in competitions) in the twelve months prior to the first date that Round 1 of the KO can be played, this is in addition to the initial scores submitted to obtain their handicap index.

The Handicap allowance is the Full Difference between the players Course Handicaps.

All rounds prior to the Final to be played over 18 holes from the White Tees

The Final to be played over 36 holes from the White Tees.

In all rounds should the match be tied after 18/36 holes sudden death match-play will commence immediately at the first hole and holes played until a winner can be declared.

Four prizes are normally awarded and the winner qualifies to play in the Millennium Trophy.

16.3 Men's Doubles

Open to Full Members. To be eligible to play in the Men's Doubles KO competition a player's Handicap Index must be based on having submitted a minimum of 6 acceptable scores (3 of which must be in competitions) in the twelve months prior to the first date that Round 1 of the KO can be played, this is in addition to the initial scores submitted to obtain their handicap index.

The Handicap allowance will be 90% of the difference from the lowest Course Handicapped player.

All rounds prior to the Final to be played over 18 holes from the White Tees

The Final to be played over 36 holes from the White Tees.

In all rounds should the match be tied after 18/36 holes sudden death match-play will commence immediately at the first hole and holes played until a winner can be declared.

Two prizes are normally awarded.

16.4 Men's Seniors Singles

Open to Full Members aged 55 or over on the final date for entries to the competition. To be eligible to play in the Men's Seniors Singles KO competition a player's Handicap Index must be based on having submitted a minimum of 6 acceptable scores (3 of which must be in competitions) in the twelve months prior to the first date that Round 1 of the KO can be played, this is in addition to the initial scores submitted to obtain their handicap index.

The Handicap allowance is the Full Difference between the players Course Handicaps.

All rounds to be played over 18 holes from the White Tees.

In all rounds should the match be tied after 18 holes sudden death match-play will commence immediately at the first hole and holes played until a winner can be declared.

Two prizes are normally awarded and the winner qualifies to play in the Millennium Trophy.

16.5 Ladies Singles

Open to Full and 6 Day Members. To be eligible to play in the Ladies Singles KO competition a player's Handicap Index must be based on having submitted a minimum of 6 acceptable scores (3 of which must be in competitions) in the twelve months prior to the first date that Round 1 of

the KO can be played, this is in addition to the initial scores submitted to obtain their handicap index.

The Handicap allowance is the Full Difference between the players Course Handicaps.

All rounds to be played over 18 holes from the Red Tees.

In all rounds should the match be tied after 18 holes sudden death match-play will commence immediately at the first hole and holes played until a winner can be declared.

Two prizes are normally awarded.

16.6 Ladies Doubles

Open to Full and 6 Day Members. To be eligible to play in the Ladies Doubles KO competition a player's Handicap Index must be based on having submitted a minimum of 6 acceptable scores (3 of which must be in competitions) in the twelve months prior to the first date that Round 1 of the KO can be played, this is in addition to the initial scores submitted to obtain their handicap index

The Handicap allowance will be 50% of the difference between the combined Course Handicaps of each side.

All rounds prior to be played over 18 holes from the Red Tees

In all rounds should the match be tied after 18 holes sudden death match-play will commence immediately at the first hole and holes played until a winner can be declared.

Two prizes are normally awarded.

16.7 Mixed Foursomes

Open to Full and 6 Day Members. To be eligible to play in the Mixed Foursomes KO competition a player's Handicap Index must be based on having submitted a minimum of 6 acceptable scores (3 of which must be in competitions) in the twelve months prior to the first date that Round 1 of the KO can be played, this is in addition to the initial scores submitted to obtain their handicap index.

The Handicap allowance is 50% of the difference between the combined Course Handicaps of each side.

All rounds to be played over 18 holes. Ladies play from the Red tees the Men from the White Tees.

In all rounds should the match be tied after 18 holes sudden death match-play will commence immediately at the first hole and holes played until a winner can be declared.

Two prizes are normally awarded.
